Dear colleagues,

We are pleased to inform you that the Mathematical Society of South-Eastern Europe will launch the 14th Mathematical Olympiad for first and second year university students (**SEEMOUS 2020**). This distinguished student competition will be hosted by the School of Mathematics of the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, Greece between **March 3 and March 8, 2020 in Thessaloniki**, Greece. The competition aspired to encourage mathematically gifted university students towards further accomplishments and to create friendly and beneficial relationships between them.

We cordially invite you to participate in SEEMOUS 2020 with a team from your university. A team may consist up to 6 students and 2 professors (a team leader and a deputy team leader). Eligible students are those who are not beyond the second university year of undergraduate studies by the end of the 2019/20 academic year or have not completed more than 120 ECTS credits. Students can form a national team to represent a country as well. The SEEMOUS regulations as well as the previous competition problems and final results can be found at <http://seemous2020.auth.gr>.

Each team can send up to three problem proposals until **February 16, 2020**.

All SEEMOUS participants will have to cover their own travel, accommodation and subsistence expenses. A participation fee to cover accommodation and subsistence are pre-paid to the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki as approved by MASSEE.
